### **Ambassador Report**

2022 was a great year for the 4-H BC Ambassador team, as many in-person 4-H activities and events resumed throughout the province. One ambassador left the program early in 2022 due to personal circumstances, but the remaining 15 ambassadors were very active and completed the following activities in 2022:

- 11 project videos created for BC Fairs
- 106 thank you's to regional and provincial 4-H sponsors
- 12 social media engagements
- 6 articles submitted to various publications
- 33 4-H promotions at public events
- 44 reports of hosting or helping with 4-H events
- 21 project and program workshops to 4-H clubs
- 10 opportunities to act as the official judge for 4-H competitions

Ambassadors noted the following activities as some personal highlights: the 4-H Festival at the PNE including a special tour with Minister of Agriculture and Food, Lana Popham, creating project videos for BC Fairs, judging 4-H competitions, wearing the Frisco the Fox costume, representing 4-H at the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebration in Victoria, and showing their 4-H Colours in November. A highlight for the whole team was the Ambassador Training Weekend hosted at Trinity Western University in Langley, from May 20-23, 2022. The training weekend included some great workshops, teambuilding activities, and a high ropes challenge.

A big change to the Ambassador program in 2022 was an adjustment to the program dates. Starting in 2023 the ambassador program will be aligned with the calendar year, and the Ambassador representative to provincial council will be selected in the fall rather than the spring. In 2022 Sarah Maloney served as the Ambassador on the 4-H BC Provincial Council. Hannah Meier served as the Ambassador on the 4-H BC Foundation, and Lark Anderson served as the BC representative on the 4-H Canada Youth Advisory Committee (YAC). In her role as 4-H Canada YAC representative for BC, Lark Anderson reported assisting with the 4-H Canada Leadership Summit, the National 4-H Members Forum, the 4-H Canada Program Innovation Committee, the 4 Minutes with 4-H series, and Show Your 4-H Colours Day.




### **Enrolment & Participation**

In 2022 we delivered four virtual Urban Online Cooking Program sessions for youth ages 9-12 years old and in 2023 we will deliver two sessions during Spring. The goal is to educate youth on culinary skills, to promote the 4-H BC program to urban areas. In 2022 the total of 90 youth attended the program.

### Urban Online 4-H Cooking Program

The Urban Online Cooking Program was codeveloped with Chefs Bonnie Jarvis and Hiro Amani to engage urban youth in hands-on food preparation and increase awareness of the 4-H program. The virtual cooking program was presented in weekly lessons over two five-week periods in the spring and again in the fall that feature recipes from different cultures while focusing on a variety of cooking skills that highlight the local bounty of what is grown in BC.



Overall, the Urban Online Cooking Programs of 2022 were very successful. The turnout average for sessions completed in 2022 consists of 22.5 delegates, increasing with each virtual session.



### Alumni Outreach

In 2022, 4-H BC reconnected with many of our former members by implementing a 4-H BC Alumni re-engagement plan.

4-H is a life-changing, life-impacting program. By identifying our Alumni, we can offer former members the opportunity to reconnect with 4-H in a meaningful way. It is our hope that 4-H Alumni will want to share their experiences with the younger generation of 4-H'ers, mentor our future leaders, and provide resources to 4-H BC through short- and long-term volunteering and financial support.

We believe that reconnecting with 4-H Alumni should be mutually beneficial. Former members can re-experience the positive feelings they had as a member—a sense of belonging, learning, personal growth, and giving back.

4-H BC chose to celebrate its alums in 2022 by offering an official 4-H BC Alumni water bottle. We also gave alums a chance to connect with former members through a private Facebook Group, which grew from 0 to 400 members in just 4 months!

### 4-H Day Camps

The 2022 Discover 4-H Day Camps were hosted with the purpose of introducing 4-H BC to cities in BC that have little to no 4-H clubs pre-existing in the area.

Discover 4-H Day Camps is a series of one day camps designed to introduce 4-H to non-member youth aged 9 - 12 from new and diverse communities. The objectives for these camps is to connect communities with the 4-H program who have otherwise been unreached or have not been provided an opportunity to become involved, to attract non-4-H-members to the program and to provide a day of fun agricultural activities for youth.

Instructional workshops and hands on activities developed around the four pillars of 4-H Canada (Community Engagement & Communications, Science & Technology, Environment & Healthy Living, and Sustainable Agriculture & Food Security) each pillar will contain two topics, one of which is an objective of the program (Leadership, Knowledge, Personal Development, and Citizenship), and the other is a related project that is easily manageable in rural and urban centres such as photography, gardening, honey bee or cavy.








### **Food for Thought**

### Field to Fork Challenge

The third annual Field to Fork Challenge brought together youth from all over British Columbia in a virtual cooking challenge using locally sourced BC ingredients! Participants in the 2022 Challenge were asked to submit a video of themselves cooking with BC ingredients and were evaluated on their presentation, recipe, and ingredient selection. The Challenge was open to BC students (ages 9 to 19) and 4-H British Columbia (4-H BC) members; submissions were judged in both junior and senior categories.

The top winners in each Field to Fork Challenge category were invited to the Field to Fork Challenge Virtual Conference on January 14, 2023. The virtual Conference celebrated winners and showcased BC dairy, strawberries, and potatoes through video farm tours, Q&A sessions with BC farmers, and cooking lessons with BC Agriculture in the Classroom Foundation (BCAITC) Chef Trevor Randle.

Conference participants were also delighted to hear words of encouragement from a surprise conference guest - BC Minister of Agriculture and Food, Hon. Pam Alexis.

The 2022 Challenge was a collaboration of BCAITC, 4-H BC, and the Youth Development Team from the BC Ministry of Agriculture and Food, with the support of Buy BC and Save-On-Foods.



The other five established districts are: Surrey/Richmond/Delta (2 clubs); Langley (5 clubs); Abbotsford (7 clubs); North Fraser (3 clubs); Chilliwack (6 clubs).

Membership was down as COVID-19 continued to impact clubs' activities early in the year. As the year progressed and COVID-19 restrictions eased, we were able to hold all regional communications events in person for the first time since the pandemic began. District judging rallies were also able to be held in person, making the 4-H members very happy to be judging live animal classes rather than photos and videos.

Summer fairs were back with full in person programs and many clubs participated in the Maple Ridge-Pitt Meadows Country Fest, Agrifair, Chilliwack Fair, the PNE and Agassiz Fair. Although numbers were down, our 4-H families were excited to be back at these summer events.

We had a full slate of Ambassadors promoting 4-H and helping clubs by judging communications, presenting workshops and generally helping out when asked. They are a great resource to our programming. Several clubs participated in a Help a Farmer Day where they assisted with agricultural land clean up after the devastating floods of the previous fall. 4-H to the Extreme was postponed from our usual March date and held in November instead. Members were encouraged to bring a friend to help recruit new members. Although it was smaller in numbers than previous years, it received great reviews from the participants who came away with new knowledge and enthusiasm for 4-H. We also had members participate in Senior Members' Weekend, Food for Thought, Provincial Communication Finals, Provincial Judging Competition, Special Topic Educational Display Competition, Online Cooking Club, Field to Fork

Challenge, Photography Contest, Sunflower Growing Contest and fundraising with the Gator Lottery.

Many thanks to all of our 4-H supporters, volunteers, leaders, families and members! We are looking forward to growing our membership through 2023 and returning to pre-pandemic numbers and beyond!





### 4-H British Columbia Foundation President Report

I am pleased to provide this 4-H British Columbia Foundation report for the fiscal year Jan 1 to Dec 31, 2022. As 4-H BC Foundation becomes better known by the 4-H community, alumni and friends of 4-H, new donors are coming on board to support 4-H youth into the future.

Foundation revenues have come from investments, 4-H Club assessments, donations, and fundraising. Total Foundation assets as of Dec 31, 2022 were \$ 1,543,530.

4-H BC Provincial Council received \$ 70,000 for programs and services and \$ 12,411 was disbursed from Designated Gifts, for 4-H member scholarships and to local 4-H BC regional and district programs for a total of \$ 82,411 disbursed back to the 4-H BC community in 2022. New donations were \$ 57,674. \$ 15,000 via 4-H BC Provincial Council's annual 4-H Club Assessment Initiative was also invested. Investment earnings were \$44,480. Returns continue to be a result of a well-balanced investment policy and our investment advisors at CIBC Wood Gundy.

4-H BC Foundation continues to expand its mandate through Designated Gifts, whereby a donor pre-designates the annual earnings from their donation. Currently, five '4-H Endowments' fund specific 4-H Scholarships and two '4-H Designated Donations' provide funds to a designated 4-H Region and a designated 4-H District.

Together with 4-H BC Manager, Aleda Welch, and Fund Development Coordinator, Danusia Tarr, 4-H BC Foundation continues to move forward on fund development initiatives that fit the 4-H BC Strategic Plan. Securing sustainable resources through an 'integrated fund development and partnership strategy is essential to meeting 4-H British Columbia's vision



of "Empowered and skilled young people committed to making positive change in their communities.'

4-H BC Foundation continues to encourage Planned Legacy Giving. I encourage all to consider a bequest through your will with the wording "I direct my Trustee (executor) to give to the 4-H British Columbia Foundation the sum of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ from my estate." Everyone benefits from the power of a planned gift ... you, your family, and 4-H as your charity of choice.
