How to Use this Guide:

- Read the opportunity description and all information prior to completing the Application Form.
- Use the correct Application Form. Pay attention to any supplemental materials that may be required (cover letter, essay, or references).
- Registration Fee (cheque or money order) to be payable to 4-H BC and submitted with your application to your **Regional Council** by the **Regional Deadline** for program selection. This fee will be returned if you are not selected for the program. Ask your District Key Leader for this date.
- Please be sure to mail the application materials to the correct location. Some applications for scholarships must be sent directly to the sponsor organization.
- **Programs with insufficient applicant numbers by deadline date will be cancelled.**

Note: Late program and/or scholarship applications will not be accepted.

Provincial 4-H Program Cancellation Policy

- If cancelling, delegate must notify the 4-H BC Office in writing at least 30 days prior to program start date to obtain 100% fee refund
- If cancelling, delegates who notify the 4-H BC Office in writing during the period of 30 days to 7 days prior to program start date will receive 50% registration fee refund
- Delegates, who cancel within 7 days of the program start date, fail to notify in writing or fail to attend the program, will receive no refund.

Agri-Career Quest (ACQ)

Target Audience:	16 - 22 year olds (before January 1st)
Opportunity Date:	May 6-11, 2019
Location:	Begin and end in Abbotsford
Registration Fee:	\$300 (Registration fee includes: all cost of accommodation, food & program May 6-11 inclusive. Cost effective travel options to and from Abbotsford will be coordinated by 4-H BC and communicated to delegates. Travel options will vary by region but may include charter bus, mileage reimbursement for members traveling in a carpool, or flight subsidies.)
No. of Delegates:	38

This experience is a six day program for 4-H members and non 4-H students to explore careers in the agriculture industry. Most of the program takes place on a charter bus to allow for agriculture tour stops in different regions of BC. Participants will get to see and experience first-hand the diversity of agriculture in BC and the careers available in the industry. There is a career building component where participants learn how to market themselves through resume, interview and networking skills. Location: Thompson Rivers University
(Kamloops)

Registration Fee: \$300 (Registration fee includes: all cost of accommodation, food & program from July 8-13 inclusive. Cost effective travel options to and from Kamloops will be coordinated by 4-H BC and communicated to delegates. Travel options will vary by region but may include charter bus, mileage reimbursement for members traveling in a carpool, or flight subsidies.)

This five day program takes a look at important youth issues, developing leadership skills and building self-esteem. 4-H members from across the province get a chance to meet other 4-H'ers and build new friendships in a fun, educational environment.

The 4-H BC Ambassadors promote awareness of 4-H opportunities in their region and around the province, and act as resource people for 4-H members, leaders and the public. Participants attend one training session a year and participate in up to three conference calls. Ambassadors are required to have a leading role in at least 10 different activities in their region during the year. There are a total of 20 Ambassadors to represent 4-H in BC each year, however only 10 will be selected annually (for a two year term).

- Confident public speaker
- Knowledgeable about the 4-H program
- Excellent leadership, communication, and personal development skills
- High degree of maturity in dealing with a variety of situations
- Achieved at least three years in 4-H
- Must possess a Junior Proficiency Certificate
- Attendance at Ambassador annual training program on the May long weekend in Abbotsford is mandatory
